To the sixth Newport (Isle of Wight) Jazz Weekend, an event organised by local musicians and jazz fans.

2016 was our most successful year to date, and what a great day we had at Medina Theatre with Stacey Kent following on from the California State University big band. Another highly successful aspect of the 2016 event was our first ever jazz tuition course. The course itself was met with universal approval by everyone who attended it, and the students and tutors concert which followed it, was well attended and received. Our aims have always been to try to encourage a greater appreciation of, and involvement in, all forms of Jazz. This has to start with younger musicians and music fans, and we are already hopeful that the tuition course in 2017 will be even better than last year. We are also keeping our £4 ticket price for anyone aged 21 or under in order to encourage young audience members. What better treat for music fans of any age (but particularly young ones) than to see the full National Youth Jazz. Orchestra at Medina Theatre, They have been on our "radar" for a while and we are delighted to have booked them this year. There is only one event at Medina this year, and a slightly different format to previous years as we will end the festival in the intimate setting of the Apollo Theatre where Liane Carroll, fresh from winning the Vocal category in the British Jazz Awards 2016, will bring her trio to close Sunday's programme. 

Nigel met Vasilis, another band leader, about six years ago, and Vasilis worked with Nigel during the well received 2016 tour, which played 56 dates across the UK. Today's gig will feature numbers from recent albums as well as unique arrangements of standards and should be a real highlight of the weekend. Some of the material draws on famous guitar/ sax collaborations like Sonny Rollins/Jim Hall, John Coltrane/Kenny Burrell, Stan Getz/Jimmy Raney, Paul Desmond/Ed Bickert (or Jim Hall) and Stanley Turrentine/Kenny Burrell. Expect virtuoso musicianship from Vasilis and Nigel, who won the 2016 Jazz Guitarist award, with fire, sensitivity and a collaborative

approach that has fired audiences across the UK. Vasilis was awarded a jazz scholarship to the prestigious Berklee College of Music in 1999, and since then has appeared alongside most of the very best jazz musicians across Europe and, since 2002, in the UK. His explosive style means that he is in great demand as a saxophonist for popular music and as a session musician. Vasilis and Nigel are joined this evening by Dario de Lecce (bass) whose brief but fastrising career has taken him, via Italy and the USA, to London in 2012 and he is now in high demand. 



Ray Brown's illustrious career spanned the be-bop days of jazz after the War to later eras of jazz up to his death in 2002. Sandy was raised on the Isle of Wight and quickly made his way through the NYJO ranks to become one of the most successful musicians from the Island. The trio features a star cast of planist Graham Harvey and drummer Josh Morrison. Graham initially started off as a classical planist, before moving to the USA to study jazz, later returning to the UK to become director of jazz/funk outfit Incognito, before beginning an ongoing stint as planist to Stacey Kent. He's also performed with Stevie Wonder, recorded with George Benson and played with Clark Terry and Warren Vache, Josh Morrison has played alongside most of the UK's leading lights including vocalist Stacey Kent, with whom he continues to tour internationally. He is featured on her 2013 album, The Changing Lights. Josh also works regularly with groups lead by planists Rob Barron and Gabriel Latchin
