[A] SOL GRIMSHAW'S BLUE ORCHIDS

Sol Grimshaw (guitar) grew up on the Isle of Wight but has spent the last 4 years in London studying at the Guildhall School of Music. Since being in London Sol has established himself in many of the London scenes most especially the Gypsy Jazz and Early jazz scene. The group draws inspiration from the original drummer-less piano trios from the 40s and 50s. The group was formed by Sol and Cody Moss (piano) and also includes Immy Churchill (vocals), Dafydd Williams (tenor sax) and Lorenzo Morabito (double bass).

[B] PETE LONG'S BENNY GOODMAN QUINTET

Pete Long (clarinet) and Anthony Kerr (vibraphone) have been at the forefronts of the UK jazz scene on their respective instruments for many years. Pete and Anthony are joined by another native of the Isle of Wight, Sandy Suchodolski (double bass) who is making a great career for himself in London, Terry Seabrook (piano) and Bobby Worth (drums).

In high demand as a harpist and vocalist, Australian-born Tara Minton's gig in the Methodist Church is keenly awaited. She is proudly endorsed by Camac Harps and holds a master's degree in jazz performance from The Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Tara is a passionate music educator and advocate for the harp in jazz and improvised music. She was invited back to the Guildhall at the beginning of 2023 as a guest artist working with the jazz department and has given masterclasses in jazz and improvisation at many of the country's top music colleges. She has recorded two albums including "Two For the Road" in 2022 with Ed Babar (double bass) with whom she plays here, alongside David Ingamells (drums).

Trumpeter, composer, band leader, educator and writer - Jay Phelps has performed with some of the world's top names. With an instantly recognisable warm and projecting tone, Canadian born Phelps is a household name on the Jazz scene in the UK and his international presence is steadily growing. Jay went on to study at Trinity College of Music, gaining an honours in Jazz Theory and Performance. During this time at college, Phelps created and co-lead the UK jazz sensation, Empirical. Jay is joined by top jazz guitarist Tom Ford who has just moved to the Isle of Wight from Birmingham. Tom majored in Jazz Composition and Performance at Berklee College of Music. There is another local connection with Jon Thorne (double bass). Sascha Create is on drums.




[G] JIM MULLEN ORGAN TRIO


