In the soothing bossa nova world, there's no better alchemic duo artistry than Love & Bossa Nova. That's when perfect-pitch, Brazilborn vocalist Daniela Soledade conjoins with superb nylon-stringed guitar master Nate Najar from the USA. What transpires is their eloquent,



romantic project Love & Bossa Nova. The Love & Bossa Nova show has been selling out houses in such jazz-loving capitals as Paris and London, in clubs and concerts in North America, and homecoming dates that wow the Brazilian crowds. The songs, sung in English and Portuguese, sway and swing in tender beauty and simplicity as well as gently build into the upbeat with syncopated beats over a samba rhythm. It makes for a pleasantly cool and warm appeal.

A great evening is in store at Quay Arts, as two top Island-based acts are supported by jazz DJ Jim Kerr and the Ryde School Swing Band who will open the evening at 7pm. The upstairs and downstairs bands will play staggered sets which will allow the audience to move between gigs and see a bit of everything.

Gary Plumley (tenor sax) is a regular member of Sax Appeal and his broad, soulful sound was often heard

alongside Terry Callier and Snowboy and the Latin Section. Gary's jazz/funk project on the Island, the Alleycats, now features the excellent George Bone (hammond organ) and Island-based drum maestro Rupert Brown.

Upstairs, the very popular Shades of Ellington quartet are led by bandleader and renowned double bassist Jon Thorne. Accompanied by the inventive Chris Jones (drums) and masterful Tom Barker (piano), the quartet is completed by vocalist Olivia Cure, a recent but very welcome addition to the local jazz scene. Formed several years ago



during their time spent studying at various UK conservatoires, the Weatherbirds now perform concerts, shows and gigs and are also available for private function bookings. The band is a bit of a 'family business' and features a 3 brothers frontline - Magnus, Joe and Daniel Pickering on trumpet, clarinet and trombone. An additional bonus for local music fans, is the inclusion of Sol Grimshaw (guitar) who of course performed last year with his Blue Orchids project. Two other local musicians are also in the Weatherbirds today – Sandor Stankovics (tuba) and Terry Dickinson (drums).



David Newton was made a Fellow of Leeds College of Music in 2003 and in 2019, was voted 'Best Jazz Pianist for the sixteenth time by the Jazz audience of the UK in the British Jazz Awards.
